Admission Criteria & **Application Process**

Fellowship candidates are required to have:

- Graduated from an ARC-PA accredited PA program with provided transcripts
- Board eligibility or board certification by the NCCPA
- Valid Michigan PA license
- Michigan controlled substance license
- Three (3) letters of recommendation
- AHA ACLS Certification

The candidate must maintain all needed licensing and certification throughout the duration of the fellowship. Additionally, the candidate must be able to maintain health screenings and immunization standards set forth by institutional and CDC policy. Admission review will be based on work and life experience, education and academic records, letters of recommendation, personal statements, full completion of the application and personal interview.

Program Description

Trinity Health Muskegon offers an 18-month post-graduate fellowship for physician assistants (PAs) in the area of internal medicine. This is accomplished through a system-wide involvement of Trinity Health.

The program trains highly qualified graduate PAs through a diverse didactic instruction and advanced clinical education experience to provide quality care to those in need.

Our program accepts two (2) NCCPA accredited PAs per cycle. These PAs must hold a valid Michigan license and state-controlled substance license. The academic calendar runs for a total of 18 months.

Upon graduation, fellows will be awarded a Trinity Health certificate that documents completion of the post-graduate fellowship. PAs will have the needed number of hours, procedure proficiency and CMEs to sit for their NCCPA CAQ in hospital medicine.

Such certification will make the graduate more competitive in the job market in both an inpatient and outpatient hospital medicine setting. Additionally, exposure would be gained inside the Trinity Health regional market which enhances potential employment after successful completion of the fellowship.

Daily Hours & Responsibilities

Throughout the fellowship, these will vary depending on the clinical rotation and education needs. It is important to realize that health care is a 24-hour, 365-day need in our community. Weekend and night responsibilities are a part of this need. Hours and rotations are based on ACGME standards.

Curriculum

The fellowship will prepare the candidate for enhanced professional practice in the knowledge, understanding and implementation of skill sets with regards to the common disease processes, skills and procedures associated with both hospital- and ambulatory-based internal medicine practice.

The fellowship will begin with a six (6)-month introduction to the health care system. This will entail two (2) 3-month cycles of rotations in the following areas:

First Cycle (3 Months)

- Critical care medicine
- Simulation Lab proctoring for procedure learning
- Inpatient hospital-based internal medicine practice

Second Cycle (3 Months)

- Critical care medicine
- Inpatient hospital-based internal medicine practice with additional responsibilities
- Outpatient internal medicine clinic responsibilities
