The circular drive around St. Joe's is the path to wellness. It leads you to vital health services – the Cancer Center, the Family Birth Center, the ER, Michigan Heart...the Farm. It's that last sign that most people don't expect to see. St. Joe's Ann Arbor is one of the first hospitals in the nation and the first in Southeast Michigan to have its very own farm.

In three years, the Farm has gone from an idea – to a vision – to three hoop houses (solar-heated greenhouses to grow fresh produce year round), a 22-acre bed with rows of fruits and vegetables, a quarter-acre co-op garden, and a beehive that's operated by the Ypsilanti Food Cooperative. "Since its inception, the Farm has remained almost entirely volunteer run," said Dave Raymond, SJMH Director of Planning and Design. "For us, it's a passion." And, in June 2013, St. Joe's was awarded the Achievement Citation for "innovative programming that changes people's lives" by Catholic Health Association (CHA) of the United States.

Farm fresh greens, lettuce, broccoli, garlic, peppers, tomatoes and more are offered to inpatients and at Joe's Java Café and cafeteria. And, each Wednesday patients, visitors and staff flock to the Patient Tower lobby to the Farmer's Market for fruits,



vegetables and flowers grown on the Farm at St. Joe's as well as partnering farms.

"Fresh food tastes better and it makes you feel better," Lisa McDowell, SJMHS Director of Clinical Nutrition, told CHA when describing the inpatient meals. "We want those trays to be trays of love; a special, colorful tray that tells patients, 'we want you to heal.' "

"The growing awareness about sustainable farming has led the hospital to also purchase locally grown, better quality fruits and vegetables and support area farmers," said Dan Bair, Director of Hospital Farming. And, Since 2010, St. Joe's has donated more than 3,200 pounds of surplus vegetables to local food banks, including Food Gatherers, and to patients in need who are fighting cancer and might otherwise go without beneficial nutrients.

"Our commitment to health is not simply medical, we aim to enrich the entire range of well being: mind, body and spirit," said Rob Casalou, President & CEO St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor and Livingston.

"An amazing part of my job is working with kids in St. Joe's ShapeDown program who are fighting obesity. They walk to the farm with their families to learn how food grows and how to select vegetables for picking and eating. Then they prepare it back at the Hospital's education center kitchen. It's a journey toward healthy eating."

St. Joe's commitment to education extends to giving local students valuable exposure to an agricultural environment where health care is the focus. The Hospital has developed a sustainable agriculture internship program for master's and doctoral students studying public health and nutrition at the University of Michigan. The program has been nationally recognized as an innovative way to train students in the clinical and farm setting.



Clinical Hoop House

The First Clinical Hoop House

St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor and the Eisenhower Center, which provides outpatient services and residential programs for those recovering from traumatic brain injury, collaborated to design and build the first accessible clinical hoop house in the U.S. at the Farm at St. Joe's. The hoop house will be used to provide therapy to patients from both organizations, many who are recovering from stroke or injury from accidents. The hoop house was designed with ample aisles between raised planters, some that allow easy access and some that help build upper body strength or dexterity from a seated position in their wheelchair.

"The hoop house is a unique and beautifully designed facility that will be a stepping stone for patients towards greater independence," said David Steinberg, MD, Medical Director for Rehabilitation services and Vice Chair for the department of Internal Medicine. "So many of us use gardening for spiritual renewal and as a stress reliever. There's nothing better than putting food on your table that you grew from seed."

Healing Inside and Out

"Every place that I went for a wig, I realized that they were not able to understand the journey of a cancer patient or how to address any of my questions and side effects," Trish Tyl described her experience fighting breast cancer seven years ago. "I was looking for a place that was warm and positive feeling and realized such a place did not exist."

A licensed cosmetologist and hair stylist for 15 years, Trish envisioned opening a spa-like place for services like wig styling and fitting, make-up consultations, oncology massage therapy and prosthesis and bra fitting. Her dream came at just the right time. She heard from a friend that St. Mary Mercy Livonia was opening an Image Recovery Center (IRC) for cancer patients. Trish was hired for the role of Coordinator, which included certification through Johns Hopkins hospital as a Clinical Cosmetologist and Specialist.

Today, patients from St. Mary Mercy Livonia and hospitals throughout the community rely on Trish and the IRC team including a second Clinical Specialist and an Oncology Massage Therapist. The team works closely with doctors and staff to understand the effects of different cancers and treatments such as hair loss, fatigue and pain. They build personalized care plans that provide physical, emotional and spiritual relief.

"Patients always feel empowered when they realize that I have gone though what they are about to go through," said Tyl. "They are amazed that all my hair came back and that I look and feel so `normal.' It gives them great hope and helps with their fears."

Our patients say it best. Shelly Y. wrote this letter to David Spivey, SMML President & CEO:

"I recently had need to visit the Helen Palmer Image Recovery Center. My hair was falling out, due to chemotherapy. I had no idea what a precious resource the Center would be for me. Trish Tyl took me under her wing. She became my educator, my guide and my cheerleader. She helped me make the difficult decision of how to cut my hair and prepared me for wearing a wig. Unbelievably, she styled a wig for me in such a way that my friends and family think the style is more flattering than when I had my own hair. Ms. Tyl makes a woman feel safe, comfortable and normal again. In fact, I told her I'd like to live at the boutique while I go through this treatment process. That's how reassuring it is to visit the Center during such a frightening time. I am so grateful you have this service for women. Thank you."

"We truly believe that we are part of the cancer treatment plan. We go to great lengths to educate and empower patients to get through their journey with dignity and confidence," explained Tyl. "No one is ever turned away here. Our goal is to help everyone, no matter what their financial situation is." Gifts from the community and staff, including Roberta Palmer's gift of \$500,000 to name Livonia's Image Recovery Center for her mother Helen Palmer, made it possible to open in 2007. The IRC is a model for services at St. Joe's Ann Arbor through the Inspirit Salon. And, St. Joe's Oakland is currently creating a space to meet the essential image needs of patients fighting cancer. Fungal Update

One Year Later, fungal infection patients praise St. Joe for groundbreaking expertise and compassion

Last year at this time, hundreds of people across the nation were unknowingly injected with pain shots filled with a black fungus. Since then, their lives have never been the same.

On September 8, 2013, TV news anchor Heather Unruh of ABC's Boston affiliate WCVB TV 5 met with a group of these patients at St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor to talk about what occurred in their lives and what is happening now.

"It was very compelling and emotional," said Michele Szczypka, SJMHS Chief Marketing Officer. Szczypka said the patients spoke highly of the physicians and caregivers of St. Joe's. "They felt thankful because the medicine was far superior at St. Joe's compared with the rest of the country. They went out of their way to thank our medical community."

Nationwide, the CDC reports more than 750 people contracted fungal meningitis and other infections linked to the use of injectable steroids from three recalled lots distributed by the New England Compounding Center (NECC).

Michigan experienced the highest concentration of fungal infections. St. Joe's took the lead treating 195 confirmed cases, more than any hospital in the country. One patient remains hospitalized. Many others continue treatments through the Fungal Outbreak Clinic at Reichert Health Building. St. Joe's doctors opened the clinic shortly after the outbreak last fall to screen 629 patients who received the contaminated steroids

at a nearby pain clinic. The team's approach and findings of spinal abscesses in many patients helped shape the diagnostic advice CDC issued for physicians nationwide.

"I think that our proactive approach caused us to find patients before they developed dramatic symptoms," Dr. David Vandenberg, Medical Director of the Outpatient Clinic, told the Boston Globe. Vandenberg said many who have completed treatment have done well, but a few are still reporting rashes, headaches, blurry vision, and mental slowing. The hospital intends to follow-up with patients it treated for fungal infections indefinitely.
